As a valued member of our Mental Wellness & Minobimaadizing (At the Place of Good Living) team and under the the direction of the Director of Mental Wellness and Minobimaadizing services, you will oversee all aspects of developing, implementing, monitoring, evaluating and administering the FASD/Child Nutrition program in accordance with our MCCSS service accountability agreement and Maamwesying's policies and procedures.

### Qualifications:

- Post-secondary degree in health, social science, adult education, or a related discipline, or a combination of undergraduate degree and significant experience.
- Two to three years' work experience in FASD including program coordination, prevention, intervention and treatment.
- Three years community development experience with First Nation communities for capacity building, education and awareness activities.
- Knowledge and interest in health issues affecting First Nation people specifically with FASD/Child Nutrition and Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome.
- Demonstrated understanding of data collection, program planning, development and implementation.
- Strong organizational and analytical skills with an attentiveness to detail
- Must have a valid driver's license

*Given the traditional practices of Aboriginal people, from time to time exposure to smoke from the burning of sacred medicines such as tobacco, sweet grass, sage or cedar may occur. Accommodations for the disabled will be available upon request. An offer of employment will be conditional upon an acceptable vulnerable sector police records check. Hiring of Aboriginal People will be given preference, as allowed under Section 14 of the Ontario Human Rights Code – Special Programs*
